ABOUT THIS FORUM

The March 2024 ASCP Pavement Technical Forum will feature 8 speakers across the full spectrum of the concrete paving industry, with topics as widely varied.

The morning sessions will see **Anna-Carin Brink** (BG&E) give a summary as well as conference highlights of the 14th EUPAVE International Symposium, followed by an investigation and comparison study of primes and strength in concrete by **Dr Hamidreza Sahebzaani** (SAMI Biumen Technologies).

Craig Heidrich and **Jamie Egan** (ASCP) will then present the Annual General Meeting, followed by a presentation on Low Carbon Concrete by **Craig Heidrich** (ADAA), which will lead into La networking lunch.

After lunch, **John Hodgkinson, AM** will present on the basic model of concrete behaviour leading to contemporary practice for jointed pavements, followed by a session on world infrastructure condition by **Geoff Ayton** then a brief discussion with **Jamie Egan** (Acciona) on the importance of quarry material selection and a wrap up and reflection with **Tim Buckingham-Jones** (Aurecon) on the German Concrete Pavement Experience.

Jamie Egan (ASCP) will close out the day with a general update from ASCP including update on Gunlake Quarry Tour Promotion.
